

# 11 Wuhan alumni list on Forbes "30 Under 30 China"

On July 20, Forbes China unveiled the 2017 edition of its annual "30 Under 30 China" list which includes 30 members under the age of 30 for each of the 10 categories that make up the list. The 10 categories include entertainment and sports, social entrepreneurs and education. Eleven young entrepreneurs who have graduated from universities in Wuhan are on the list.

In the first half of this year, Forbes China revealed its selections. The candidates were picked from 1,700 exceptional high achievers who were born later than May 15, 1987.

According to Forbes, the criteria for selection includes: leadership, entrepreneurial thinking and achievements, and the possibility of changing convention over the next half century.

## China Cosco Shipping to have Yangtze River-basin headquarters in Wuhan

The Wuhan municipal government signed a strategic cooperation framework agreement with China Cosco Shipping Corporation, the largest shipping group in the world, on July 19.

According to the agreement, Cosco Shipping is planning to set up its Yangtze River basin headquarters in Wuhan. The

corporation will also cooperate with Wuhan in a number of projects: building a Xianglushan railway and water transport hub, creating a global service center, developing near-sea direct container lines, promoting river-sea lines, and expanding automobile roll-on/roll-off shipping. The projects of river-sea lines and a global service

center will be initiated first.

According to Xu Lirong, Chairman of Cosco Shipping, the company has been optimistic about the location advantage and talent resources of Wuhan. At present, the company is actively promoting the construction of the Wuhan Yangtze River-basin hub platform.

## 1st Chinese city with 1 million Alipay bus transit e-card users

During the first month of "building a cashless city of Wuhan," the city had more than one million people use Wuhan bus transit e-cards while taking a bus. According to the data released on July 20 by the Ant Financial Services Group, Wuhan boasts nine million Alipay mobile app users, becoming the second largest mobile payment city nationwide.

At present, eighteen public hospitals and 200 parking lots in Wuhan accept Alipay mobile payment. In the past month, the number of Wuhan people paying for registration and treatment at a hospital by Alipay has increased by 40%.

In terms of business service, the number of merchants applying QR code for online payment has increased by 48%.

### News in numbers

#### RMB 88.4 billion

The Wuhan Customs revealed that in the first half of this year, the total import and export value in Hubei Province was RMB 140.44 billion, an increase of 25% year-on-year. The total import and export value of Wuhan was RMB 88.4 billion, a 29.5% year-on-year increase.

#### RMB 580 million

The China Baowu Steel Group Corporation announced on July 19 that they realized a profit of RMB 580 million in the first half of this year, RMB 330 million more than the budget schedule. According to the official website of Wuhan Iron & Steel (Group) Corporation, the group's current business involves real estate, green urban construction, water resource management, health care, and iron and steel production. Its steel products are mainly manufactured in Ezhou, Hubei.

With the support of the Baowu Steel Group, Wuhan Iron & Steel (Group) Corporation has set up a RMB 3 billion fund for the green urban construction industry.
